### Introduction

### ANOC

The Association of National Olympic Committees (ANOC) was established in June 1979 during the Constitutive General Assembly in San Juan, Puerto Rico. ANOC now represents the interests of 206 National Olympic Committees (NOCs) across the five Olympic continents. ANOC is administered from its headquarters in the Olympic Capital, Lausanne, where it has been based since June 2010.

ANOC strives to protect and promote the collective interests of the NOCs, delivering consistent, dedicated support and advocating on their behalf within the Olympic Family. ANOC also aims to strengthen the relationships between the NOCs and the Olympic Family for the benefit of the entire Olympic Movement.

### The ANOC World Beach Games in San Diego

ANOC's vision was to develop a World Beach Games that would attract new audiences and provide a platform for NOCs to engage with millions of young people around the world.

The ANOC Events Working Group, established in December 2013 and chaired originally by the ANOC President, was tasked with developing the concept for the Games. The Working Group was supported by international experts and collaborated with the IOC, International Federations and other Olympic stakeholders to ensure the Games would be sustainable and bring widespread benefits to the Olympic Movement. Timothy Fok is the current chair of the ANOC Events Commission.

The ANOC World Beach Games will deliver elite sport that excites: a dynamic beach, action and water sports programme featuring prominent, world-class athletes brought together in one truly global festival for the very first time. The event will be built on a new, sustainable multisport model, with 100% temporary venues operating in harmony with the world's most captivating beach locations.

Ultimately, the ANOC World Beach Games aims to be the pinnacle of global excellence in beach, action and water sports, connecting new disciplines and new stars to a new generation of fans.

### The inaugural ANOC World Beach Games: San Diego 2019

The inaugural edition of the ANOC World Beach Games will take place on Mission Beach in the city of San Diego, California, from 10-14 October 2019. At the ANOC General Assembly in Washington in 2015, San Diego was unanimously approved as the host city of the first ever edition of the ANOC World Beach Games which was set for 2017.

After extensive dialogue with NOCs and IFs, the ANOC Executive Council decided to move the inaugural edition of the Games to 2019 to ensure that NOCs and IFs had the optimum time to prepare their athletes for the event.

The ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019 will feature approximately 1,360 athletes from every Olympic continent. The sports programme comprises 14 fresh and dynamic sports with 16 disciplines in total:

- Triathlon Aquathlon
- Basketball 3X3
- Sports Climbing Bouldering
- Handball Beach Handball
- Karate Individual Kata
- Sailing Kitefoil Racing
- Skateboarding Park
- Football Beach Soccer
- Surfing Shortboard & Longboard
- Swimming Open Water 5km
- Tennis Beach Tennis
- Beach Volleyball 4x4
- Waterskiing Waterski Jump & Wakeboard
- Wrestling Beach Wrestling

The ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019 will take place at a single, integrated competition site at Mission Beach – located approximately 14km from downtown San Diego, on Southern California's beautiful Pacific coast. All competition venues will be temporary, with no permanent Games footprint. NOCs and their teams will be housed in hotel accommodation approximately 8.5km from the competition site.

The Games is expected to attract approximately 40,000 fans each day, with world-class sports competition staged alongside an international music, culture and entertainment festival. The event will also be broadcast live around the world via digital and traditional broadcast channels. Participants will be able to enjoy the attractions that make San Diego one of the world's top tourist destinations, from the stunning natural beauty of the Southern California coastline to renowned destinations like Sea World, the Gas Lamp District and San Diego Zoo.

The 2019 ANOC General Assembly will take place in San Diego immediately prior to the ANOC World Beach Games from 8-10 October.



## Practical Information

To help you prepare your teams for the ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019 on 10-14 October 2019, ANOC has put together the following practical information.

### Sports/events

The sports and events on the programme have now been finalised in cooperation with the International Federations (IFs) and the Local Organising Committee in San Diego.

You will find in this document the full programme as well as the maximum number of athletes per event. For the number of officials, each NOC will be allocated a number of officials per qualified event, plus additional accreditations for the NOC staff. The NOCs will also have the opportunity to bring additional team officials to support the athletes during the Games. The rational of Aos and ATOs will be informed to the NOCs together with the accreditation information.

In this document you will also find all the individual qualification criteria for each event by sport.

### **Qualification period**

End of the qualification period for the Games is July 15 2019. With the exception of Open Water Swimming, which deadline is July 17 2019, after the World Championship in Korea. The accreditation and sports entries will be handled by the NOCs in close cooperation with the Ifs and sent to the AWBG team at the ANOC office in Lausanne.

### Finances/support

Air fares (economy class) as well as hotel rooms (double occupancy) with three meals per day will be covered by the Local Organising Committee for athletes and officials. The air tickets will be booked through the AWBG team in Lausanne.

Teams are planned to arrive and depart from the San Diego, Tijuana or Los Angeles airports, according to the flight schedule and the NOC Travel Policy.



### Accommodation/village

The teams will be accommodated at three hotels in the Hotel Circle about 15 minutes from Mission Beach.

### **Transportation**

Shuttle busses to and from the airport in San Diego or Tijuana and to and from Mission Beach each day will be organised by the Local Organising Committee.

### Medical

A medical office will be located in the Village and in the competition area as well as in the hotel for NOC/IFs. The ANOC medical team, together with the Chief medical doctor of the Local Organising Committee, will be responsible for all medical service as well as doping tests.

### Accommodation for NOC/IF Presidents and Secretary Generals

The ANOC General Assembly and other ANOC meetings will take place on the days before the opening of the ANOC World Beach Games according to the programme, which you can find enclosed. Accommodation will be provided in the Grand Manchester Hyatt Hotel in San Diego during the ANOC meetings and during the first days of the competitions for all NOCs/IFs.

### Chef de Mission Seminar

The Chef de Mission Seminar will be organized on 8-11 July 2019, for the NOCs that have qualified athletes and the NOCs who will potentially qualify athletes on the remaining sports yet to finish the qualification process. In the cases where NOCs will potentially qualify athletes, special consultation will take place between the NOC/ANOC/IF.

### Team clothing and sports equipment

The IOC's rule 50 applies to the ANOC World Beach Games for both clothing and sports equipment. For clothing the manufacturer identification can have a maximum of 30 square centimeters, plus the additional product technology identification with maximum 10 square centimeters. Sports equipment brand size shall be as featured on sports equipment sold on the market at least 6 months prior to the games.

### **Venues**

All competitions will take place at temporary venues on or close to the famous Mission Beach in San Diego.

### CAS

CAS will have an office in San Diego for the duration of the Games.

### Athletes and Team Officials Eligibility

All athletes and team officials must comply with IOC Rule 40 for the ANOC World Beach Games in order to be able to be accredited.



### ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

- All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to, Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions)
- 2. Additional IF Requirements:
  - To be eligible to participate in the ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019, all

- athletes must be on the ITU Aquathlon Ranking for the Qualification Places and Host Country Places
- The criteria/points system of the ITU Aquathlon Ranking as well as the qualification criteria for all the events counting towards the ranking can be found on the official website of International Triathlon Union, www.triathlon.org/about/documents

### **QUALIFICATION PATHWAY**

### **QUALIFICATION PLACES**

The 24 highest ranked athletes, on the ITU Aquathlon Ranking as of 3 June 2019 will be allocated one (1) quota place for their NOC,

respecting the maximum quota allocation per NOC per event.

### **HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

The Host Country is guaranteed two (2) quota places per gender provided that they comply with the eligibility criteria outlined above

If there are less than two (2) eligible athletes in any of the genders, those unused quota places will be added through the ITU Aquathlon Ranking.

### **INVITATION PLACES**

Four (4) quota places per gender will be allocated to the invitation and they are made available to NOCs at the ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019.

On 10 June 2019, the ITU will propose to ANOC to invite eligible NOCs. The deadline for NOCs to accept the invitation is 24 June 2019. The Invitation Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of

invitation places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the concerned sport.

If the Invitation Commission is not able to allocate an Invitation Place, it will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, according to the ITU Aquathlon Ranking, respecting the maximum number of athletes per NOC specified above.

### **CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES**

Following the last event of the qualification period, ITU will publish the results on its website (www.triathlon.org/results).

ITU will inform the respective NOCs of their

allocated quota places within seven (7) days of the end of the qualification period.

The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks to confirm if they wish to use these quota places.

### **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES**

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated as follows:

Unused quota place from the ITU Aquathlon Ranking will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, according to ITU Aquathlon Ranking, respecting the maximum number of athletes per NOC.

### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Any unused Host Country Place will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, according to the

ITU Aquathlon Ranking, respecting the maximum number of athletes per NOC.

### **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED INVITATION PLACES**

Unused Invitation Place(s) will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, according to the ITU

Aquathlon Ranking, respecting the maximum number of athletes per NOC.

### **MIXED RELAY QUALIFICATION**

All NOCs, which are represented by minimum one (1) woman and one (1) man athlete are eligible to enter one (1) team for the Mixed Relay competition.

All NOCs, which are represented by minimum two (2) women and two (2) men athletes are eligible to enter two (2) teams for the Mixed Relay competition.

### ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

### Age

To be eligible to participate in the ANOC World Beach Games, athletes must be of the U23 age category and must have been born between 1 January 1996 and 31 December 2003. At least two (2) of the four (4) athletes per team have to turn 19 years or older in 2019.

### **Nationality**

**Athletes** 

- Must hold the legal nationality of the country that they represent before 1 January 2018; and
- Must present a passport of that country issued by the competent authorities before the end of the registration period; and
- Subject to Special Cases regulated in Art 6-27 of the FIBA Internal Regulations, may not

have previously played for the national team (basketball or 3x3) of another country in an Official Competition of FIBA (see Art. 2-2 of the FIBA Internal Regulations)

### **Additional IF Requirements:**

- Athletes must be registered in play.fiba3x3.com with a confirmed FIBA 3x3 Profile
- Belong to a National Federation of FIBA that organised a minimum of three (3) events of FIBA 3x3 Competitions in their territory in the twelve (12) months prior to 1 November 2018 and hold a valid 3x3 e-learning certification on 1 November 2018.

### **QUALIFICATION PATHWAY**

### **QUALIFICATION PLACES**

### 4 Men (1 team) & 4 Women (1 team)

The host country shall obtain one (1) quota place per gender for their NOC.

### 60 Men (15 teams) & 60 Women (15 teams)

Top four (4) countries per gender from Africa, Americas, Europe and Asia-Pacific) on 1 November 2018 shall obtain one (1) quota place for that gender for their NOC with the caveat below.

The region to which the host country belongs shall get only three (3) quota places per gender for their NOC in addition to the host country.

### **HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

The host country will automatically qualify one (1) team and one (1) female team, on the condition

that the athletes meet the eligibility requirements described under the section "Athlete Eligibility".

### **CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES**

FIBA will publish the FIBA 3x3 National Federation Ranking on 1 November 2018 and will inform the San Diego 2019 Organising Committee of the allocated quota places.

The NOCs will then have until 30 November 2018, to confirm if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in the section "Qualification Timeline".

### **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES**

If a quota place allocated is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next best-ranked team from an NOC not yet qualified according to the section "Qualification Pathway".

Any unused host country places will be reallocated in the same gender to the next best-ranked

### **CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES**

IFSC will publish results of the events listed above immediately following the completion of the event on its website. Regarding the World Championships, the IFSC will confirm to the NOCs within seven (7) days) after the completion of the event the quota places they have achieved.

After the end of Bouldering season (or by 15 June 2019 1, even if Bouldering EC scheduled after this date), IFSC will confirm to the NOCs the quota places they have achieved at the World Championships + World Cup Ranking + Continental Events (if any).

The NOCs will then have limited time to confirm to IFSC and the San Diego 2019 Organising Committee if they wish to use these quota places. The deadline

which will apply for the confirmation of NOC quotas will be communicated with an official letter send to NOCs. Please note a strict deadline will apply, probably around 10 days after the NOC receives the letter. The host country quota place is to be confirmed to the IFSC and the San Diego 2019 Organising Committee with the same deadline.

The qualification system is based on a hierarchical order; the importance of the events is specified as following:

- 1. Bouldering World Championships 2018
- 2. Bouldering World Cup Ranking 2019
- 3. Continental Events (or World Cup Ranking 2019)
- 4. Host Country quota place

### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

### **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES**

If a quota place allocated is not confirmed by the NOC within the confirmation date, the place will be reallocated to the next best-ranked athletes not yet qualified at the respective event where the quota place was obtained. A stricter deadline will be applied for the confirmation of reallocated athletes. The deadline will be communicated with an official letter sent to NOCs.

All reallocated quota place need to be confirmed to the IFSC and the San Diego 2019 Organising Committee at least fifteen (15) days before the entries closing date by the NOC.

### **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

The host country quota is to be reallocated based on the World Cup Bouldering ranking to the World

Cup Bouldering ranking.

Only NOCs of countries whose National Tennis Associations have been members of the ITF prior to Tuesday 1 January 2019 may nominate teams for participation in the 2019 AWBG Beach Tennis Event.

### **QUALIFICATION PATHWAY**

In this Qualification System, the following definitions are used:

ITF Race to San Diego Ranking this is calculated based on the 2018 ITF Beach Tennis World Ranking points system applied through to, and including, the week commencing 10 June 2019. Please note this ranking is different

to the new ITF Beach Tennis World Ranking introduced in January 2019.

Combined Ranking means the ranking of a Doubles or Mixed Doubles Team obtained by adding together each athlete's individual ITF Beach Tennis World Ranking

If any of the above five (5) Regions do not have a representative via Direct Acceptance, the highest ranked team from that Region will qualify, provided the Combined Ranking of the team does not exceed 500.

Should a region already be represented, or the Region not have a nominated pair meeting the Combined Ranking requirement, that quota place will be allocated to the team with the next highest Combined Ranking not yet qualified from any region, based on the ITF Race to San Diego Ranking as at Monday 24 June 2019.

### **MIXED DOUBLES**

### Up to 24 teams (up to 48 athletes)

Mixed Doubles teams will be selected from athletes that have already been accepted for the Men's and Women's Doubles events. Entries for the Mix Doubles must be made on site to the ITF by 11h00 on TBC dates.

Up to 24 teams for the Mixed Doubles events will qualify as follows:

- 19 Direct Acceptances, based on the Combined Ranking as at Monday 24 June 2019
- 1 Host Country team
- 4 Regional Representation places
- 24 Total

Mixed Doubles teams will be selected from athletes that have already been accepted for the Men's and Women's Doubles events.

### **Direct Acceptance**

Up to 19 teams will receive Direct Acceptance into the Mixed Doubles event based on the ITF Race to San Diego Ranking as at Monday 24 June 2019 subject to a maximum of two (2) teams per NOC.

### **Host Country**

If the Host Country does not have a representative team via Direct Acceptance, one team will qualify automatically.

### **Regional Representation Places**

- Africa: 1
- Asia & Oceania: 1
- North America, Central America and Caribbean: 1
- Europe: 1
- South America: 1

If any of the above five (5) Regions do not have a representative via Direct Acceptance, the highest ranked team from that Region will qualify.

Should a region already be represented, that quota place will be allocated to the team with the next highest Combined Ranking not yet qualified from any region, based on the ITF Race to San Diego Ranking as at Monday 24 June 2019.

In the unlikely event of Mixed Doubles entries falling below 16 teams, the ITF retains the right to allocate a 3rd team place to an NOC, based on the Combined Ranking.

The ITF will write to NOCs on Tuesday 25 June 2019 requesting each NOC's nominations for their men's and women's doubles team(s).

The NOCs will then have until close of business (1700hrs GMT) Monday 01 July 2019, to submit their nominations to the ITF.

The ITF will confirm the names of those teams qualified for the AWBG on Wednesday 03 July 2019.

### REALLOCATION IN EVENT OF WITHDRAWAL

If a qualified team subsequently withdraws, the quota place will be reallocated as follows (up to the final reallocation date of Monday 30 September 2019):

Direct Acceptance Places – reallocated to the next highest ranked team on the ITF Race to San Diego Ranking as at Monday 24 June 2019.

- Host Country Place should the Host Country not be able to nominate a replacement team, the place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked team on the ITF Race to San Diego Ranking as at Monday 24 June 2019.
- Regional Representation Places reallocated to the next highest ranked team from that region, subject to the nominated team meeting all eligibility and ranking requirements. Should no pair meet these requirements the place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked team on the ITF Race to San Diego Ranking as at Monday 24 June 2019 from any region.

In making determinations on allocated slots, WBG2019, FIVB and ANOC may consider factors, if deemed relevant, including, but not limited to:

- Marketing and TV values of the region towards ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019;
- 2. Field depth and competition strength;
- 3. International, regional and national competition results including strength of competition and consistency of performance;
- 4. Widely and regularly practising national athletes;
- 5. Demonstrated availability of athletes to participate in the ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019; and
- Any other factor(s) considered relevant by ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019, FIVB and ANOC.

### **HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

USA, as Host Country, is guaranteed one (1) quota place (one team) per gender. Athletes selected to

represent the Host Country must meet the criteria set forth in the section "Athlete Eligibility".

### **CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES**

Following each qualification event, ANOC World Beach Games San Diego 2019 will publish the results on its website.

Once the top 10 are selected, the 11th and 12th would either be the next athlete on the list or a substitute to provide Confederation representation. If athletes decline to participate, a substitution is required. The method used is:

- If an athlete declines then he/she can be replaced by an athlete from the same country as long as that athlete is rated higher than the lowest ranked athlete in the event, with the exception that the lowest ranked athlete does not include athletes selected as substitutes for Confederation representation
- If that is not the case, then the next athlete on the original list is selected

### **HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

Two (2) Invitation places per discipline (one (1) man

and one (1) woman).

If a weight category counts less than eight (8) athletes and the quota place has to be reallocated, it will be reallocated to the Universality.

Any unused Host Country Place will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC, according to the UWW

Ranking, respecting the maximum number of athletes per NOC.

### **REALLOCATION OF UNUSED INVITATION PLACES**

For each place obtained by the Host Country through the qualification phase or not used by the Host Country, the corresponding number of Host Country places will be reallocated to the

Universality Places.

The number of Host Country places reallocated may not be higher than eight (8).

UWW will, in collaboration with ANOC, allocate the unused places to the best ranked NOCs that requested a guota and that have participated in
